

Dear Members,

Spring has begun and the weather is starting to show its sunny side.

Because we have had a break-in in the Club and two thefts in the car park, the Committee has decided to install security cameras throughout. The surveillance is conducted by a large monitor which has been installed in the office. At the moment there are four cameras in the car park and one installed in the entrance foyer. There are plans to install more cameras in the future.



In August we had a severe hailstorm which resulted in the hail blocking the gutters on the Rhein-Donau Hall (which is rented out to Dance Power), causing severe water damage to the hall and to the pool room below. Thanks to our former treasurer, Dieter Pflaumbaum, who last year increased our insurance by a considerable margin, the cost of repairing the damage is completely covered.

Since COVID is now practically a thing of the past, we are having many new events and private functions in the club. Much to our delight we are also welcoming many new members every month.

When Oktoberfest tickets went on sale on 1 August, we were able to confirm that we had already sold \$19 000 worth of tickets in the first eight hours! By the end of August, we had sold \$95 000 worth, so we are expecting to have every night of the Oktoberfest weekends sold out.

I would like to wish all our members who are not feeling well a quick recovery, so that we may see them back again soon in the Club.






Railway Group

Over the last couple of months the Model Train Group has had numerous absent members, with work commitments, illness and others on holiday. This has




resulted in not much work being done on updating the Railway.




Table Tennis Group
