Ursula Deck President Dear Members,

The new committee has started to work and we already passed the Club's first financial quarter. The year 2021/22 will be a challenging year for all of us. As we have decided in the AGM, a lot of investments have to be organized, the major one financed by the grant of the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries - Office of Multicultural Interests. We are also improving the office to comply with safety regulations.

Our new Club Manager Petra is doing a great job. We already see the improvements in the very efficient way she handling the affairs of the Club administration. Our membership is also increasing and it is very encouraging to see how many new members are accepted into the club at each committee meeting.

Covid-19 is still with us and looking at the development in NSW, Europe etc., the virus will be a threat to our health and the business community for many years to come as the vaccination in Australia does not seem to take off and I hear from a lot of people they do not like the AstraZeneca vaccine and will not get vaccinated until another, more effective vaccine will be made available to all. This may also create a problem in the future as the Government doesn't seem to be prepared to give a choice of different vaccines to the people.

We have seen in the past that our WA Government is very quick in ordering a lockdown if only a few people get affected. With the new Delta strain experts around the world say it is not a question if you get it but if you are vaccinated when you get it. We will face this problem also in WA in the future.

Therefore we have to have a plan B, in case we are facing another lockdown during some major club functions or even during the Oktoberfest which

may affect our income and consequently our financial situation. At the moment we are in a very strong financial position and we are correct to do the needed investments now. But at the same time we have to make sure that we will have enough reserves to get through a year with less income. Without the



Oktoberfest, the Club will not be able to reach a positive result by the end of the year. It is therefore very important to look for various options to save some money in the meantime.

I feel in these times we should come back to the original spirit which our Club was built on: VOLUNTARY WORK.

In the last extended committee meeting I asked all group leaders that each group gets involved in assisting with some jobs during the Oktoberfest nights. This alone would save the club approx. AUD 4,000. I have also proposed to the committee some other areas where we will be able to save some money.

Hopefully everything will be ok and we are not facing any restrictions which would mean we have more reserves but we cannot be sure and it is better to be careful now than sorry later. As the treasurer I have to look at all the options and together with the committee we have to assess the risks for the next few years because we are living in a time of uncertainties. Let us work together to ensure that we are prepared for all the challenges we may face in the future.

Turning 50 in style (aka seeing Abraham or Sarah)

Dutch birthdays are a big thing and very hard work for the person whose birthday it is. Family and friends, even acquaintances come to visit, shake hands with all other guests, sit down and wait to be served by the birthday boy or girl.

The Dutch 50th birthday, however, is something different: full of eccentricities, nonsense, and good old fashion fun!



When Dutch people turn fifty they are said to be either "seeing Abraham" or "seeing Sara".

In this case, to "see" Sarah or Abraham is a biblical reference. The original meaning is still up for debate, but it seems to include adultery, stoning, barren-women,

seeing ghosts, ageing, death, and sinning – yes, all the elements necessary for a rousing bible story!! Somewhere amidst the judgements and morals there is a rather literal reference to turning 50 years old and "seeing Abraham". How it then made its way into the Dutch lexicon is anyone's guess...

The Dutch clearly decided to put their own spin on the biblical tale. When Dutch people hit the big 5-0 in the Lowlands, the birthday celebrations tend to include either a cake or pastry symbolising the ageing birthday boy or girl. Somehow, over time, the tradition evolved and that little pastry person morphed into a life-size doll in the likeness of the guest of honour! Think scarecrow-esque figures on front lawns, human paper-mâché travesties and five-meter-tall blow-up balloons of greying women (aka Sarah) or balding men (aka Abraham).

Celebrations in the Lowlands are not complete without some witty poems - such ditties, written by friends and family, often accompany the festivities.



Admittedly, this particular tradition has lost some steam in recent years yet, as both Neerlandia's President and vice-President have or will soon have their 50th birthdays we thought remembering this old Dutch tradition is



an appropriate subject for this magazine's contribution.
