

#### AFTERGLOW - Unknown

I'd like the memory of me to be a happy one. I'd like to leave an afterglow of smiles when life is done. I'd like to leave an echo whispering softly down the ways, Of happy times and laughing times and bright and sunny days. I'd like the tears of those who grieve, to dry before the sun; Of happy memories that I leave when life is done. It is some 50 years ago I had the pleasure of meeting Günter Best. Since that first meeting, Günter and I became friends and over the years we exchanged many stories and details about our respective lives. The following is a brief reflection on Günter's life and its major events as given to me or as I remember them.

### Time was his fascination, watches and clocks his world.

Günter was born on 25 Sept.1939 in Blankenrath, a small village in the German state of Rhineland Palatinate. His father, a teacher, was conscripted at the start of the second world war and was sadly killed



in action. The loss of his father, whom he greatly adored, was a terrible blow to young Günter,. He hated the war causing death of millions.. His upbringing was now left solely to his mother.

One day when Günter visited a friend of his father at his watchmaker shop he was immediately fascinated by the variety of watches and their ticking. His interest in watches was aroused. A couple of years later his class visited Feuchtwangen and its clock museum. Here Günter was absolutely amazed by the seemingly endless display of clocks and watches. Their ticking was music to his ears. It was then he knew that his vocation in life was to become a watchmaker.


Günter left school at 15 and began an apprenticeship as a jeweller and watch maker at his father's friend's business. Here he started from scratch, learning how to repair all manner of time pieces, from the smallest to the largest. These ranged from intricate wrist and pocket watches to cuckoo clocks, grandfather heirlooms and even tower clocks. After finishing his apprenticeship years, Günter enrolled in a Master Watchmaker School. After passing countless theoretical exams and practical tests he was very proud to obtain his master's degree. 7 He later moved to Switzerland, the home of watchmaking excellence, where he worked for a number of watchmakers, including Rolex. He was sent to restore the tower clocks in various European countries. This involved climbing tall, steep clocktowers to repair gears and mechanisms or adjusting weights, sometimes of colossal magnitude.

Günter immigrated to Australia, the country of his dreams, arriving in Fremantle on 17 March 1970. Here, he was met by a number of friends from Europe, who had preceded him. After initially renting a small cottage for a short time, he found a more suitable place in Armadale. Before long he had several job offers but opted to establish his own workshop from home. Günter did not waste any time joining the Master Clock and Master Watchmakers Association.

Noticing that there was no school for watchmakers in WA, he established a course at TAFE. Through his teaching and training at these courses, Günter passed on his vast and advanced knowledge to the next generation of watch makers.

He was highly respected and admired for his eagerness to further share his knowledge by way of a radio program which Günter broadcast for some time every Wednesday at midnight on 6PR talking about news in the world of time pieces, latest repair techniques, tools, and his favorite subject Time. He was so admired for the sacrifice of his time and efforts to further the standing of the MCAWA, that he was elected unopposed as its president. Günter felt honored and accepted the role, going on to serve as president for a number of years.

Shortly after his arrival in Fremantle, Günter also became a member of the Rhein-Donau Club, which he frequently visited. Here he felt at



home amongst people speaking his mother tongue and keeping traditions of his former home country alive . For the Club's annual Oktoberfests, the most traditional and considered the best in WA, Günter generously donated always a watch as a raffle prize. He was a member of several groups, for example the Skat group and the Karnevals group when they were still in existence.

On a party boat cruise organized by the Club Günter met Marlene, a lovely Scottish girl. The two fell in love and married in 1974. The happy couple became proud parents had two sons: Steven, who at present is completing his PhD in Physics ay the University of Qld, and Paul, who is a Mechanical Engineer.

Günter was a respected and well-liked member of the Club, always friendly, giving good advice, and with a gift for settling disputes peacefully. It was no surprise therefore when he was voted on to the committee and shortly thereafter elected President of the Club. These virtues and his standing in the community of Armadale also helped him to become a councilor in the City of Armadale, a position he held for 12 years.

When Günter heard of a small number of grown men, wearing colourful clothing and helmets, meeting fortnightly to pay homage to a small bird, the Uhu, and follow other strange rituals ("Schlaraffia" - a worldwide German-speaking society), he was keen to join. After securing two sponsors within the Club, he joined up straight away. Each member had to contribute a humorous item or sing or play an instrument. It was the humor and camaraderie of these men which he enjoyed so much. After passing his apprenticeship, Günter became a Junker (a young nobleman) and finally a Knight. On becoming a Knight, he was allowed to choose a name. His choice was "Pendulum the Uhrige", cleverly referring to his profession with Pendulum and Uhr (watch). It did not take him long and he soon began to rule from the throne!

Günter was in every sense of the word a true community citizen. But he was also a fighter. In 1989 he was diagnosed with Melanoma, a few years on with cancer of the colon. A few year later again he battled cancer of the scalp . which was successfully treated with radiation. He truly carried his cross with bravery. Günter was 83 years old when he peacefully passed away. He will continue to be remembered by many he loved, met, and taught.

### <u>Kitchen</u>

We are on track for the Kitchen Renovation after Oktoberfest 2023.

The club has applied for the building permit, and we have ordered the new exhaust canopy. Small works around the kitchen have started already. A new roof access point and walkway have been installed. We have professionally removed a very old ceiling containing asbestos.

#### **Wurstbude**

A new feature brick wall has been added and the Wurstbude has been extended. A new BBQ and sink have been installed and water and waste water lines connected. We will install new stainless steel splash backs behind the BBQ.





## Main Electrical Switch Board

After updating our electrical Meter, Western Power has advised the Club about noncomplying connections and the bad overall state of the MSB. The Club has engaged an Electrical Contractor to fully upgrade the MSB. These works will allow for the kitchen renovation requirements and will put us in a good position for future Solar Installations at the Club.

#### Water stations

A new Water station cabinet and tap have been installed in the beer garden, providing our members with clean filtered drinking water during times when the bar and kitchen are closed. It also gives our guests at Oktoberfest and other major functions better and easier access to drinking water. We have also Installed a double water tap at the Edelweiss Hall Bar.



#### **Edelweiss Bar Cool Room**

The Club has successfully applied for an Energy Efficiency Grant of \$25,000 for small and medium sized enterprises from the Department of Industry, Science and Resources. This grant is for the upgrade of the Edelweiss Hall Bar cool room. We are very happy about this and will try to line up these works with the Kitchen Renovation.

Whilst we know that some of these works will cause interruptions of the normal flow of activities of our groups and members, these works on our aging Club are necessary and we hope for your understanding and patience whilst we undertake these tasks to give the Club a new lease on life.



First up, a very warm welcome to our 6 newest members, Dragan, Ian & Jenny, Len & Nola and Kester. We hope you enjoy the sport and the facilities of the Club as much as we do.

We held our Schützenfest not long ago and I thought that I would relate our experience of one Schützenfest event we attended in Germany.

Last year Maria and I went to Germany and we spent a large part of our time with her family in Urbar. A small town only a few kilometres from St Goar. St Goar is on the Rhein between Koblenz and Bingen, in an area called Mittelrhein (Middle Rhein). This section of the Rhein is a world heritage area and it is very scenic with many castles to be seen on either side of the river.

While we were there, we had the opportunity to observe the St Goar shooting club Schützenfest.

The town, St Goar was established in Roman times and has been an important trading town over the centuries. The castle, Burg Rheinfels, looms over the town, it was built around 1245 and a Garrison was established there in 1344. The St Goar shooting club can trace its history back to that defence force which I believe makes it the oldest shooting club in the world

The St Goar Schützenfest is a 2 day event. On Saturday, we met the group on the banks of the Rhine where a stage was set up along with a public bar and food van. The President welcomed everyone to the event. Shortly after, leaving the general public to enjoy the day beside the Rhein, the group members travelled to the club house which is located in a secluded section of the nearby Rheinfels Castle, accessible via steps ramps and locked gates in stone walls. Here they have a 10m air rifle range, a 25m and a 50m range. The Club House and Range is tucked into one of the outer walls on the lower side of the Castle grounds. The clubhouse is what you would call 'gemutlich" cozy and welcoming. It has an outdoor terrace which has magnificent views over the Rhein.

The ladies go first. On the 25m range using a .22 rifle they shoot at the eagle which is quite large at 1.5 m high. They shoot the wings, and then the head of the eagle. When the head falls the Schützenkönigin is declared. The ladies celebrate while the men shoot their eagle. When the König is decided and after a

short celebration at the club, the group returns to the river where now a band is entertaining the crowd. The president along with other shooting dignitaries, crown the new König and Königin and festivities continue into the evening.

We didn't go Sunday but the day for the club members started with Church followed by Frühschoppen, where there were drinks and snacks with local dignitaries, and then back to the river for more entertainment by local music groups. In the afternoon there was the traditional parade, in which guest clubs also participated. The rest of the afternoon was spent relaxing on the Rhein with friends.

Amazing history and a very entertaining couple of days.
