Graham Thomas

23/12/1948 - 7/10/2025

We share with great sorrow the passing of Graham Thomas, beloved partner of Julie Patchett, father of Jason, Brent, A'mee and Dylan, and stepfather of Katrina Patchett.

Graham was a dear member and co-principal of Dancepower at the Rhein-Donau Club for 26 years. Graham was 76 years old.

Graham enjoyed an unparalleled competitive career. He was 6 times undefeated Australian professional New Vogue champion and finalist in the Australian professional Ballroom and Latin styles for many years.

He trained numerous Ballroom dancing champions to become Australian champions from all age groups and levels from juvenile, junior, youth, adult and professional sections.

Graham was a mentor to so many dancers. He was a coach and adjudicator and trained many amateurs and professionals over the years for their coaching and adjudicating diplomas.

He will be remembered for his great contribution to dance Australia-wide, his mentorship, his passion, pursuit of excellence and generosity of spirit. He had a special way of making everyone feel seen and valued.

Graham will be sadly missed by all who knew him.

A memorial was held for him at Dancepower on 28th October, followed by a celebration of his life at the Club.

Helmut was one of our longest members of the Club, though not active any more for many years.



Other members showcased an incredible variety of displays, including:





History - Die Edelweiss Tanzgruppe

written 1978 by Helmut Watzek, Gruppenleiter "Edelweiss Dancers"

DIE EDELWEISS TANZGRUPPE

Mit dem Ziel, die Bayrisch-Oesterreichische Tradition des Schuhplattlers und Volkstanzes zu erhalten, wurde im September 1960 von einer kleinen Gruppe von Klubmitgliedern die erste Tanzgruppe des Rhein Donau Klubs gegründet.

Die ersten Tänzer dieser Gruppe waren:

Pepi Krivda & Hertha Gaudlitz Steve Wallner & Anni Krispler

mit Erich Schmollengruber am Akkordeon,

Der Name der Gruppe: "Die gemütlichen Edelweisser".

Eine Menge Schwierigkeiten und Probleme waren zu überwinden bis endlich im Jahre 1965 die Tanzgruppe mit 15 Mitgliedern als selbstverwaltende Gruppe vom Klub bestätigt wurde.

Im Dezember 1967 war dann der erste grosse Auftritt ausserhalb des Klubs. Die Tänzer traten im Fernsehen des Channel 9 auf. Wieder waren Probleme zu bewältigen bis endlich die Gruppenstatuten ausgearbeitet waren und die Tanzgruppe mit ihren neuen Statuten und dem neuen Namen "Edelweisser" im September 1969 vom Klub bestätigt wurden.

Wieder ein Rückschlag: Unlösbare Probleme führten zur Auflösung der "Edelweisser" als selbstverwaltende Gruppe des Klubs.

Trotzdem versuchte eine Handvoll von Idealisten die Tanzgruppe am Leben zu erhalten.

Diese harte Arbeit wurde im April 1974 gekrönt mit der Bildung der "Edelweiss Tanzgruppe", unter der Leitung von Dieter Ducke.

Seitdem ist es trotz vieler Probleme immer aufwärts gegangen. Die Mitgliederzahl beträgt heute 40 Personen, von denen 16 bis 18 aktive Tänzer sind. Die Musik macht unser Akkordeon spieler Mario De Reggi der auch von Anfang an dabei war.

Ingwischen haben wir mit anderen Tanzgruppen deutschsprechender Klubs Verbindung aufgenommen.

Der Erfolg unserer Tänzer beim Festival in Brisbane zu Ostern 1978 hat bewiesen, dass sich harte Arbeit lohnt.

Unsere "Edelweiss Dancers" sind nun zu einem festen Bestandteil . des Kulturgeschehens in West Australien geworden. Auftritte is vielen Orten des Landes sogar bis Mt. Newman sind keine Seltenheit mehr.

Momentan bast die Tanzgruppe das "Alte Haus" um. Diese Arbeit wird von Tenzgruppenmitgliedern und deren Freunden auf freiwilliger Basia geleintet und ist nun fast fertiggestellt.
